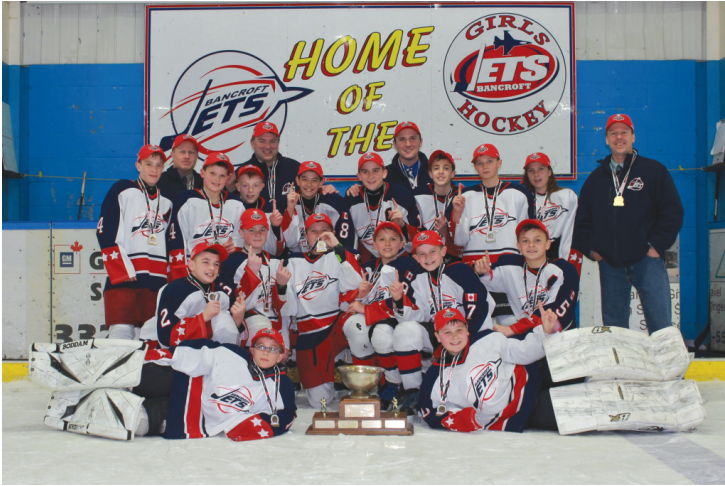


Jets win All-Ontario Championship
