The North Hastings Family Health Team honoured founders Dr. Peter McEnery and Clauge Robinson at its annual general meeting last week. McEnery, the first family physician at the community-based health team, was presented with a long-service appreciation award. His work dates back a decade to when he and a part-time assistant made up the entire staff. The staff now has over a dozen members.

McEnery announced he will work with two new doctors arriving next year for a two-year period, before sliding into a gradual retirement.

Robinson received a plaque featuring a Tom Thomson print. The award recognized Robinson's efforts to bring all community health and social agencies into partnership.

Large-scale changes are looming in health care delivery. Changes McEnery suggested, are both scary and challenging.
